The Police will be in school on Thursday afternoon for a House Event, please prepare pupils/students as applicable.

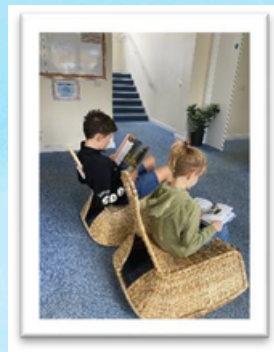
Housekeeping
